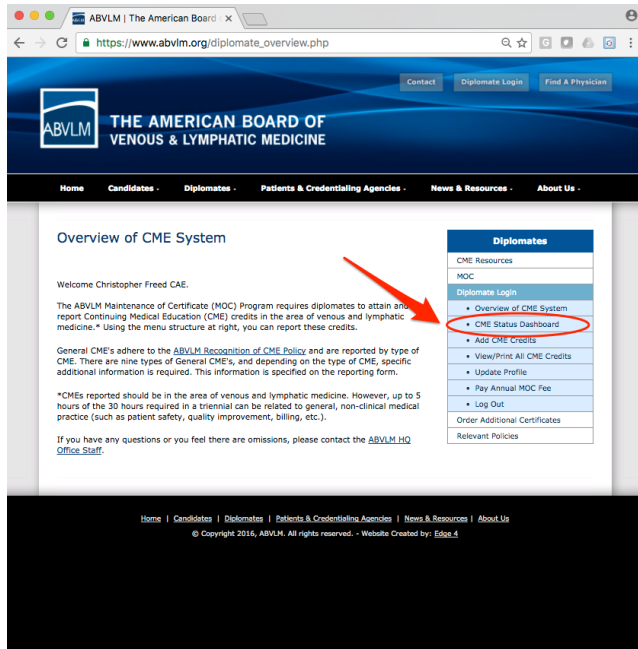


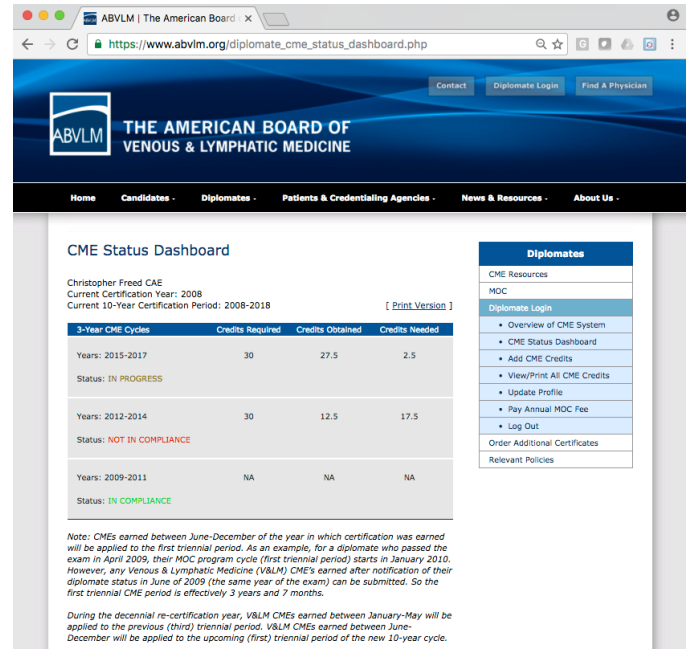
Quick Reference Guide

Reviewing Your MOC CME Status via the Online Dashboard

STEP 1: Login to the ABVLM website (see other sheet for instructions) and click on the *CME Status Dashboard* option.



STEP 2: Review whether each triennial is In Compliance or not. CME credits required, obtained, and needed are shown.



STEP 3: If you wish to view or print the detail of the CME credits already reported, you can select the option at the right of *View/Print All CME Credits*. This option will list your VLM-related CME's that you have reported in the system, in reverse chronological order.

STEP 4: To add or edit CMEs for your MOC requirements, please see the instructions on *How to Enter CME Credits* (a PDF on the ABVLM website).

Note: CME requirements generally align with calendar year triennials starting in *January of the year following your certification year*. As an example, for a diplomate who passed the exam in April 2009, their MOC program cycle (first triennial period) starts in January 2010. However, any Venous & Lymphatic Medicine (VLM) CME's earned after notification of their diplomate status in June of 2009 (the same year of the exam) can be submitted. So the first triennial CME period is effectively 3 years and 7 months.

During the 10th certification year, VLM CMEs earned between January-May will be applied to the previous (third) triennial period. VLM CMEs earned between June-December will be applied to the upcoming (first) triennial period of the new 10-year cycle.
